The existing probity requirements under the *Public Works and Procurement Act 1912*, the NSW Procurement Framework, the NSW Ministerial Code of Conduct and other integrity legislation comprehensively deal with the risk arising from pork barrelling in the context of government procurement.

Further, the Government has accepted recommendation 2 of the ICAC's Report with respect to amending the *Government Sector Finance Act 2018* to require that a Minister must not approve expenditure unless satisfied it is an efficient, effective, economical and ethical use of money and represents value for money.

At its meeting of 7 September 2022, the Procurement Board agreed to issue guidance to agencies on roles of the public sector and Ministers in procurement decision-making and to reinforce existing governance arrangements.
