Okay. And returning to the Maize building package now. Do you recall any of the other companies that tendered for the Wollstonecraft building package?---RJS, UBW. That's what I can remember off the top of my head. There could have been a, a fourth.

There was ProjectHQ?---Okay.

Were you aware that Maize, you would have been aware as project 20 manager, wouldn't you, that Maize Group tendered as well?---Yes.

And your company, Avco Construction – sorry, your father's company, Avco Construction, Consulting and Management Services.---I think they ended up, Avco didn't end up pricing.

Why would they have been listed as a tenderer for the building package at Wollstonecraft?---I think when we went out for tender I thought it might have been a good idea to, to list them and then common sense prevailed that that would have been a pretty big conflict of interest.

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I see. So you did originally intend on tendering on behalf of Avco, is that correct?---There was an intention, yes.

And then later on you decided not to go through with it because of the conflict of interest?---Yes.

And obviously Benjamin Vardanega's tendered for the building packages. What conversations did you have with him about that?---Same conversation as the civil package, that there's no way he, he could win that and then sub, whit out
