

MS CATHCART: Thank you, Commissioner. Mr Gayed, just briefly, you said you only used the alias Andrew Goodman in relation to ordering things online, personal items. Have you ever used that alias in relation to Avco?
---I could have.

Okay. What would you have used an alias for in relation to Avco?---I can't remember off the top of my head, but it could have been an email to Downer.

10 Okay. Have you got any further information about that?---None that spring to mind, but it wouldn't – it's not something that I can remember immediately.

Okay. And why would you need to use an alias when emailing Downer on behalf of Avco?---Oh, look, it depends on the context, but that's just, it wouldn't, it's not something that I can remember off the top of my head at the moment.

20 Okay. And you said your father, just to finish off on Glenbrook, you said your father was in control of Avco whilst it was being paid to store items for Glenbrook, is that correct?---Yes.

When Avco was dealing with and sending emails to Downer, who was sending those emails on behalf of Avco?---I was.

Okay. So you signed them off Ray Alfonse. Why did you draft emails on your father's behalf?---I can't tell you off the top of my head what the reasoning was behind that. At, at the time it might have been a time-sensitive issue or something that - - -

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Is there also a reason why you would have referred to Ray Alfonse in the third person or Avco in the third person? There's an example where you've said, "Let's set these guys up in the system." Is there a reason why you're using that terminology?---No particular reason.

You're not trying to conceal the fact you're related to Avco?---There was never any concealment or, or intent to conceal, no.
