Hi Kylie,

As requested by Kilmurray Lawyers, my diary note from yesterday's conversation as requested.

Darren Bullock called 17/3/15 at 12.45pm Broome time. I thought it was in response to my earlier message to his mobile just prior to the February Board meeting to see if staff issues he (and ors) had raised with me over the past years had settled down. He did not get that message and asked if I knew he had resigned from the MSB in November, which of course I was unaware of. I asked if it was because of the concerns we had previously spoken about. He replied that he had done the wrong thing in exceeding his delegations, to get his job done and keep things moving and had been asked by the CEO to take leave. He said the CEO had let him down and he had resigned. He asked if the Board members were aware of this to which I replied I did not believe so but volunteered there had been a briefing last Friday obviously about the matter, however no names were mentioned or specific details. He said he had been before ICAC. I asked if he had legal representation, to which he replied he did. I said we should not discuss this any further as it is before ICAC. I told him I was very sorry for him and advised that another staff member had also left the Board because of ongoing concerns with administrative matters. I ended the conversation as I had to go. He said he would text me his contact number, which he subsequently did.

My initial call was concern for his wellbeing. I thought it was unusual I had not heard from him during that period but assumed as his voicemail indicated, he was on leave.

Since I am now aware that there is an ICAC investigation into some aspects of the MSB, I do not intend to make further contact with Darren until the issues are satisfactorily resolved.
