Comments:
I concur with the findings of the Investigator in this matter. Given the seriousness of the allegation, the burden of proof required by the Investigator was higher than "the balance of probability".
There is no corroborative evidence to support that Officers Walker; Duncan & Graf used force on inmate during an incident at Lithgow Correctional Centre on 19 February 2014.
Despite this, there are concerns regarding the standard of reporting and the failure to utilise a video camera. The practice that at Lithgow "they only video searches after they find contraband/drugs in the cells" is flawed and should be addressed urgently.
Despite anomalies in the officers reports, [e.g. Officer Graf says he removed inmate whereas Officer Duncan says he and Officer Graf removed inmate and based on each officers version of events the impracticality of the time frame [i.e. that if Officer Duncan and Officer Graf removed inmate and therefore saw and heard nothing, how did inmate manage to leap from the bunk past Officer Walker?] only succeeding in "muddying the waters" the fact remains that there is no evidence available to refute the Officers assertion that they did not assault inmate
In reviewing the investigation, of greatest concern is that <i>if</i> the issues regarding this incident were not raised by the ICAC, it is highly probable that it would not have come to light under CSNSW processes. This is despite the incident being reviewed locally at the time.
This and the failures highlighted in Paragraph 3 only serve to heighten suspicion that something nefarious occurred in cell 208 on 19 February 2014.

Allegations of misconduct made against Correctional Officer (CO) Simon Graf regarding the Use of Force on inmate MIN at Lithgow Correctional Centre (CC) on the 19 February 2014.

#### Introduction

- CO Simon Graf is an Immediate Action Team (IAT) officer who is attached to the Lithgow CC. Officer Graf has been attached to that centre since June 2006. Officer Duncan joined CSNSW in December 2005<sup>1</sup>.
- On the 19 February 2014 Officer Graf was rostered for duty with two other officers on IAT duties at the Lithgow CC<sup>2</sup>. IAT duties at the Lithgow CC consist of responding to any serious incidents in the centre, requested tasks by the General Manager (GM), Manager of Security (MOS), Senior Assistant Superintendents' (SAS) or intelligence briefings to be followed up concerning inmates and the searching of cells for contraband.
- 3. On the morning of the 19 February 2014, Senior Correctional Officer Walker, the senior IAT officer on duty that day spoke with Intelligence Officer Assistant Superintendent (AS) Mc Murtrie regarding information he had received from an informant that an inmate named MIN in Cell 208, 5.1 Unit had a large quantity of suboxone in his cell.
- 4. SCO Walker was briefed by AS McMurtrie and he received instructions from AS McMurtrie which were directed to him by the A/MOS Stephen Taylor. Instructions from the A/MOS were for his IAT team to undertake a thorough search of Cell 208 by the IAT on duty which was occupied by inmate and try and locate the alleged drugs. SCO Walker then briefed Officer Graf and the other IAT officer on what he was told.

5.	Officer Graf with the other two IAT officers proceeded that morning to go to Cell 208 which housed inmate MIN and another inmate MIN lit is alleged that the three officers went to 5.1 Unit and the cell door to Cell 208 was opened.
6.	It is further alleged that SCO Walker then spoke to the two inmates through the inner grill door who were both lying on their cell bunk beds. As SCO Walker and the other two officers entered Cell 208, Officer Graf and the other IAT officer took inmate from the top bunk and removed him from the cell and placed him outside the cell.
7.	It is alleged that inmate who was on the bottom bunk jumped up from his bunk and appeared to throw an object towards a toilet at the rear of the cell. It is alleged that SCO Walker observed this and he then noticed that inmate trip on a plastic chair and fall towards the toilet and his body came into contact with the toilet bowl and then the ground.
8.	Inmate was then removed from the cell by SCO and placed in handcuffs. Both inmates were then taken to Cell 203 whilst the officers conducted a search of Cell 208. No drugs were found in the cell. Officer Graf and the other officers then continued on with their daily duties. This search was not photographed or video recorded.
9.	Later that morning inmate complained that he had soreness to his ribs, eye and mouth and was later seen by the Justice Health nurse for treatment. He was later taken to Lithgow Base Hospital for x-rays to his rib area <sup>3</sup> .
10.	The 48 Hour Incident/Injury Form was completed together with the Inmate Assault/Injury Form and Use of Force Forms <sup>4</sup> . An officer report was completed by Officer Graf together with other reports submitted by the other IAT officers who were present during the search. IRM No: 92719 were submitted by the senior IAT officer <sup>5</sup> .
11.	The alleged Use of Force was later reviewed by A/MOS Taylor on the 20 February 2014 and submitted to the GM O'Shea for his information and attention.
12.	On the 20 February 2014 inmate phoned his father and complained that the 'squad' who searched his cell on the 19 February 2014 had flogged him <sup>6</sup> . He also mentioned in this telephone call to his father that the 'Governor' came up to his cell door and said to him, "You talking to me cunt?" and then the squad came in and flogged him.

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- 13. He further made threats against officers attached to Lithgow CC and stated that he had a gaol made weapon in his cell. Further threats were made by the father to identify officers when they left the centre.
- 14. As a result of this monitored telephone call by Intelligence Officer AS McMurtrie, he informed the General Manager and a further search was conducted of inmate cell on the 20 February 2014 to locate the alleged weapon. Officer Graf was not part of the search party on the 20 February 2014.
- During the search a small amount of a white substance was found in a puffer located in Cell 208 occupied by inmate and located located in Cell 208 occupied by inmate and located located located was found and this search was video recorded (See Attachment 6).

#### Allegations/Issues

- i. That on the 19 February 2014, during a targeted intelligence based search of Cell 208, 5.1 Unit at Lithgow CC, assaulted inmate (MIN contrary to the requirements of section 13.7 of the Custodial Corrections Operations Procedures Manual, Using Force on Inmates.
- ii. That on the 19 February 2014, failed to use a video recorder to record the targeted intelligence based search of Cell 208, 5.1 Unit at Lithgow CC, contrary to the requirements of section 13.7 of the Custodial Corrections Operations Procedures Manual, Using Force on Inmates.
- iii. Made a false report on the Incident Reporting Module relating to the targeted intelligence based search of Cell 208, 5.1 Unit at Lithgow CC on the 19 February 2014, contrary to the requirements of section 13.1 of the Custodial Corrections Operations Procedures Manual, Serious Incident Reporting.

## Investigation

16. On the 4 March 2015 GM O'Shea, Lithgow CC was seen and a statement taken off him regarding the search of inmate cell on the 19 February 2014<sup>7</sup>. In his statement GM O'Shea remembers that he was rostered on duty

on the 19 February 2014 and that the centre was in lock down due to searches being conducted of the cells at the centre<sup>8</sup>.

- GM O'Shea was given a copy of the recorded conversation between inmate and his father on the 19 February 2014. GM O'Shea admitted to attending 5.1 Unit at the centre where he could hear inmates being verbally abusive towards staff and he told them over the knock-up system to settle down as staff were busy and would attend their needs as soon as possible.
- 18. GM O'Shea categorically denies being verbally abusive towards inmate as claimed in the telephone conversation with his father and did not instruct any officer to physically abuse or assault inmate
- 19. GM O'Shea reviewed the Use of Force package submitted by the officers, which included the officer reports from Officers Walker, Duncan, Graf and McMurtrie. Also contained in the package were the 48 Hour Incident Form, Justice Health Incident/Assault Form and Inmate Assault Questionnaire Form and IRM submitted by SCO Walker<sup>9</sup>.
- 20. On the 4 March 2015 a statement was obtained from AS McMurtrie, Intelligence Officer at the Lithgow CC<sup>10</sup>. In his statement AS McMurtrie states that he submitted a report to the General Manager on the 19 February 2014 regarding information he had received from an informant that inmate in Cell 208 at 5.1 Unit had a large quantity of drugs in his cell<sup>11</sup>.
- 21. AS McMurtrie documented this information on an Intelligence Report together with other information he had heard on a phone intercept (OTS) between inmate and his father on the 20 February 2014. In this call inmate complained that the 'squad' had assaulted him when they searched his cell on the 19 February 2014<sup>12</sup>.
- 22. Further threats are made on the telephone calls inmate made to his father stating that he had a gaol made weapon in his cell and to find out who the officers are so that his father can wait outside the gaol and confront them. This information was passed on to the Manager of Security (MOS) and the General Manager for their information and attention.
- 23. On the 25 February 2014 contact was made with Senior Assistant Superintendent (SAS) Turton requesting a statement regarding his knowledge of the incident involving inmate on the 19 February 2014.

- 24. On the 4 March 2015 SAS Turton was spoken to at Lithgow CC where a draft statement was signed by him. SAS Turton was rostered for duty on the 19 February 2014 in Sector 2 at 8am.
- 25. In his statement SAS Turton acknowledges that he supervised the 48 Hour Incident/Injury Notification Form and the Inmate Assault Questionnaire Form on that day as part of his duties. He confirmed that his signature appears on both those forms 13 and was not involved in the Use of Force on inmate
- 26. On the 5 March 2015 a statement was obtained from A/MOS Taylor regarding his knowledge of the Use of Force on inmate I on the 19 February  $2014^{14}$ .
- In his statement A/MOS Taylor states that according to the Lithgow roster for 27. the 19 February 2014 he was the A/MOS that day. A/MOS Taylor was shown the 48 Hour Incident Notification Form together with the other documents, including officer reports he reviewed as the Use of Force package prepared regarding the search of inmate cell. A/MOS Taylor agreed that he reviewed the Use of Force and accepted the content of the reports and other documentation submitted with the package. A/MOS Taylor after his review gave the documents to the General Manager for his attention 15.
- 28. The CSNSW Investigation Branch received a letter dated 27 January 2015 from A/Assistant Commissioner Custodial Corrections, Ms Marilyn Wright an appointment to conduct an investigation into three allegations of alleged misconduct against Officer Graf regarding the incident with inmate | the 19 February 2014 at Lithgow CC<sup>16</sup>.
- 29. Copies of Instruments addressed to Officer Graf also dated the 27 January 2014 were also received at the Investigations Branch alleging that he may have engaged in misconduct11.
- 30. On the 17 February 2015 contact was made with Officer Graf by email advising him that Senior Investigations Officer Glasheen had carriage of this investigation and offering him an interview concerning the three alleged allegations of misconduct 18.
- 31. Contact was made with Officer Graf on the 18 February 2015 where he agreed to be interviewed at the Lithgow CC on the 24 February 2015. This was confirmed in an email sent to GM O'Shea on the 18 February 2015<sup>19</sup>.

- 32. Officer Graf was sent a letter confirming the time and date of the interview, a copy of his report, copy of IRM 92719, Options for Interview and relevant sections of the Government Sector Employment Act & Rules<sup>20</sup>.
- 33. On the 24 February 2015 Officer Graf was electronically interviewed at the Lithgow CC where he was asked a number of questions regarding the search of inmate cell on the 19 February 2014 and he stated the following<sup>21</sup>;
- Q. How long have you been employed by CSNSW?
- A. Just shy of 10 years.
- Q. How long have you been employed at Lithgow CC?
- A. Roughly 4 years.
- Q. Were you on duty on the 19 February 2014 at Lithgow CC?
- A. Yes. (SHOWN ROSTER FOR THE 19/2/2014)<sup>22</sup>
- Q. What duties were you performing that day?
- A. IAT 2.
- Q. Can you tell me what IAT (Immediate Action Team) does?
- A. Just respond to any incidents in the Centre, do cell searches and escorts.
- Q. How long have you been an IAT Officer?
- A. Maybe 7 years.
- Q. Were you performing IAT duties on the 19 February 2014 with SCO Walker and Officer Duncan?
- A. Yes, I was.

- Q. Did you submit a report dated the 19 February 2014 regarding an incident with inmate MIN in cell 208 at 5.1 Unit?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Is that report true and correct?
- A. Well, it is.

- A. No.

#### Recording searches on a video camera

- Q. Now you were aware that there was Intel that a cell occupied by inmate and another inmate were supposed to have drugs hidden in their cell. Once receiving this information why did you not take a video camera with you to video the search for this alleged contraband in the cell? Why didn't you take a video camera?
- A. Because we just usually do, they weren't aggressive that I remember, usually what we do if we are searching a cell and find something then we'll start the camera and bring the inmate back in.
- Q. Well did you have a video camera with you that day?
- A. I don't think I did but one of us would have, yes.
- Q. Did you have a still camera with you that day?
- A. One of us would have, yes.
- Q. Did you take still photographs of the cell?
- A. I don't think so.

# Operations Procedural Manual (OPM) Section 13.9<sup>23</sup>.

- Q. I will now show you a copy of OPM Section, Operations Procedural Manual at 13.9 which contains the recording and managing of video evidence?
- A. Yes.
- Q. The policy overview states that the policy applies whenever there is an incident or likely event that may later require investigation. This includes video recordings of uses of force, assaults, deaths in custody, escapes, fights, fire industrial accidents and suspected drug trafficking. In this case information was received that an inmate had possible drugs in his cell, why as the searching officer did you not take a video camera with you to record the cell search?
- A. No response.

- Q. Do you want a break?
- A. No. I'm just trying to think of my answer. I suppose we do a lot of cell searches and Intel and nine out of ten turn up nothing. That's I guess why we start a recording if something is found, it's left in situ and we start recording then.
- Q. But the OPM states that you should do it?
- A. Yes.
- Q. In other words if you did do it you had video evidence of the incident?
- A. Understand.
- Q. And any complaints that are made regarding the search could be handled properly?
- A. Yes.

#### IRM submitted by SCO Walker on the 19/2/2014

- Q. I am now going to show you an IRM completed by SCO Walker?
- A. Yeah.
- Q. Now were you aware that SCO Walker submitted an IRM 92719 regarding the search of the cell occupied by inmate
- A. Oh, we do it after everything like that.
- Q. Can you just read the document?
- A. Yeah.
- Q. If you look at the summary it states, 'During an intel based search IAT were directed by the MOS to search Cell 208 in 5.1 Unit with direction to specifically look for Buprenorphine. Inmates were spoken to at the cell door prior to entry and appeared compliant and reasonable. Now that is contained in the IRM Report. Is that correct?
- A Yes, that's right.
- Q. Now in the IRM in the detail reason it further states, Use of Force was not fully recorded?
- A. Yes.
- Q. No force anticipated. Is that correct?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Now in the column where photos of inmates taken it states, 'Still photos as part of the standard Centre procedure'.
- A. Yeah, it says that.
- Q. Can you tell me where the photographs are?

I have been informed that inmate jumped up from the bottom bunk and Q. moved towards SCO Walker trying to get to the toilet. Were you aware of this? A. No, all I saw was jump off the bottom bunk stand up and go towards the back and that's all I saw. Q. Did SCO Walker talk to you about this incident that day? A. I don't believe so, no. Q. Were you aware that inmate had tripped on the plastic chair? Did SCO Walker tell you that? Afterwards he said that, yes. Α. Now can you remember if the plastic chair was near the toilet when you Q. entered the cell? A. No idea. Q. Now did you see inmate fall on the toilet? No. Α.

- Q. I'll just show you an Incident Assault Form submitted by the NUM A Sinclair on the 19/2/2014 and injuries noted contusion left eye/check, lip, bruising to the right side of torso over ribs. Have you seen that form before?
- A. Yeah.
- Q. Were you aware of those injuries?
- A. No.
- Q. Are you aware of how he received these injuries?
- A. No, I wasn't in the cell.
- Q. Now when inmate was removed from the cell did you see any injuries on him?

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# Case Notes of the search on the 19 February 2014

- Q. Now did you make a case note entry on inmate case file regarding the search of his cell on the 19<sup>th</sup>?
- A. No.
- Q. Do you usually make case notes?
- A. No.
- Q. If a search is conducted of a cell and contraband is found in the cell and even if it is not found would a case note be done?
- A. I don't make a habit of doing that, no.
- Q. Do you think a case note would have been correct to do on that day?
- A. Not by me, no.
- Q. Now did you recover any contraband in Cell 208 occupied by inmate on the 19<sup>th</sup>?
- A. Not that I know of, no.
- Q. Now did inmate resist SCO Walker when you entered the cell that day?
- A. I don't know.
- Q. Just a general question, how many searches would you do a week regarding your duties as an IAT Officer?
- A. Oh, it varies but some weeks we can do a lot, some weeks not many, it averages out maybe five a week.
- Q. Are these videoed?
- A. Not unless something's found.
- Q. But you find the article and then you start the video?
- A. Yeah, just leave it and then we usually bring the inmate in and do it all on video and put it in the events bag in front of them.
- Q. Why would you not start the video on entering the cell?
- A. Because a search can take hours.
- Q. Is police action taken if you find contraband in the cells?
- A. I think it depends on how much then it is up to the boss.
- Q. Do you video the cell when you find it?
- A. Yes, we start as soon as we find something. I know what you are saying about planting it but it's just that way I suppose we've done it.
- Q. It just covers you for anything you find in there?
- A. Everything will be videoed from now on, everything.

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# 1st Allegation of Alleged Misconduct - Response

- Q. Now the first allegation of alleged misconduct is that you on the 19 of February 2014, during a targeted intelligence based search of Cell 208 at Lithgow Correctional Centre assaulted inmate MIN contrary to the requirements of Section 13.7 of the Custodial Corrections Operations Procedures Manual using Force on Inmates. What is your reply to that allegation? Can I read what I've written here? A. Q. You will give me a copy of that? Α. You can have it. To the best of my knowledge on this day IAT attended Cell 208 in 5.1 Unit. SCO Walker entered the cell and I followed. I retrieved the second inmate from then top bunk and, and escorted him from the cell. refused, laid down, I lifted him on his knees and I knelt
  - SCO Walker and First Class Duncan removed from the cell and I returned from floor and secured him in a cell. I did not come into contact with at all my whole dealings in this incident were with inmate at all no time did I assault for (THAT HAS BEEN READ ONTO THE RECORD).

#### 2nd Allegation of Alleged Misconduct - Response

down outside the cell facing the wall.

- Q. The second allegation of alleged misconduct is that you on the 19 of February 2014, failed to use a video recorder to record the targeted intelligence based search of Cell 208 at Lithgow Correctional Centre contrary to the requirements of Section 13.7 of the Custodial Operations Procedure Manual using force on inmates. What is your reply to that allegation?
- A. A video recorder was not used it was only a cell search. It was a spontaneous event. There was no aggression displayed by or and no indication a use of force was likely.

IAT generally record all their cell searches. If contraband is located a video is started, the inmate brought into the cell and the item sealed in an evidence bag in front of the inmate.

- Q. On that day there was no contraband found?
- A. Not on that day, no.

# 3<sup>rd</sup> Allegation of Alleged Misconduct - Response

Q. The third allegation is that you made a false report on the Incident Module relating to the targeted intelligence based search of Cell 208 at Lithgow Correctional Centre on the 19 of February 2014, contrary to the requirements

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- of Section 13.1 of the Custodial Corrections Operation Procedures Manual Serious Incident Reporting. What is your reply in relation to that allegation?
- A. I have a question first, when it says Incident Reporting Module, are you talking about the IRM or just my written report?
- Q. Your report?
- A. The report that I submitted was not false it was a report of what I did on this particular incident, everything was correct on it.

# Phone call from inmate to his father played to Officer Graf

- Q. Having heard that telephone call, is there anything you would like to say in respect of that phone call, the content of the phone call?
- A. That did not happen. I did not assault inmate

#### Comments

- 34. It would appear and it is well documented by the Intelligence Officer AS McMurtrie that he received information that inmate had contraband in the cell he shared with inmate. This information was received from an informant.
- 35. AS McMurtrie submitted two Intelligence Reports regarding this and other information he received when monitoring telephone calls between inmate and his father on the 20 February 2014.
- 36. The telephone call by inmate to his father on the 20 February 2014 is the day after his cell was searched. He tells his father that he was flogged by the 'squad' when they searched his cell on the 19 February 2014. He further tells his father that has been locked in for two days since the search.
- 37. There is documentation that inmate was treated for injuries to his eye, mouth and ribs on the 19 February 2014 after the search of his cell. He was later taken to the Lithgow Hospital for x-rays to his rib area.
- Although inmate had injuries to his face and rib area, these injuries could have been sustained when he allegedly tripped over the plastic chair and came in contact with the toilet bowl and concrete floor. When inmate was interviewed by SAS Turton and completed the Inmate Assault/Injury Questionnaire he declined to comment on how he received these injuries.
- 39. Officer Graf has denied assaulting inmate on the 19 February 2014. There is no supporting evidence to support that inmate was assaulted by Officer Graf or any other officer during the search of his cell on the 19 February 2014. Inmate his cell mate did not see any assault take place.

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40.	The senior officer on receiving information that there was a large amount of drugs in Cell 208, 5.1 Unit occupied by inmate should have instructed the two officers who were with him that the search of the cell would be videoed to gain evidence if contraband was found or located in the cell. In any case searches for contraband should be video recorded to negate any complaints of alleged misconduct.
41.	However this was not done and Officer Graf did state that they only video searches after they find contraband / drugs in the cells. This practise could lead to complaints being made by inmates that articles were planted in the cell by not starting the video camera when entering the cell which would alleviate that claim. This is supported in the OPM, Section 13.9 'Recording & Managing Video Evidence'. (Attachment 23)
42.	Inmate was interviewed as part of the investigation process and stated that he remembers the search of Cell 208 on the 19 February 2014 <sup>25</sup> . In his interview inmate has stated that he remembers the 19 February 2014 when the squad (IAT) came to his cell.
43.	Inmate stated that he was bedded on the top bunk and got dragged off the bunk by officers and taken outside. He states that inmate was standing near the toilet when he got dragged out of the cell. He then saw inmate who was handcuffed and being dragged out of the cell.
44.	Inmate did not see any officer assault inmate however he remembers seeing injuries later that evening to inmate eye and mouth and was told by inmate that the officers bashed him.
Findi	ngs
45.	There is evidence that a search took place of Cell 208, 5.1 Unit on the 19 February 2014 which was occupied by inmates and
46.	There is also evidence that a further search of that cell was undertaken on the 20 February 2014 by officers who were looking for a gaol made weapon. This is contained in the telephone calls made by inmate to his father on the 20 February 2014.
47.	After inmate was removed from Cell 208 on the 19 February 2014, there is evidence that inmate was treated for injuries to his lip, eye and ribs by the NUM nurse and was later taken to Lithgow Hospital for x-rays to his rib area.
48.	Officer Graf has denied assaulting inmate when he was removed from his cell on the 19 February 2014. It is alleged that inmate got up from his bunk, threw something towards the toilet, tripped on a plastic

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- chair and fell onto the toilet bowl. This may have been how he received those injuries and cannot be discounted.
- 49. Inmate was interviewed by police on the 30 April 2014 from the Corrective Services Investigations Unit (CSIU) and declined to provide a statement (See Attachment 29).
- 50. The roster for the 20 February 2014 has Officer Graf on IAT duties at the Lithgow CC. The recorded video search of Cell 208 on the 20 February 2014 does not identify Officer Duncan as participating in that search.

# 1<sup>st</sup> Allegation - Finding

- 48. That on the 19 February 2014, during a targeted intelligence based search of Cell 208, 5.1 Unit at Lithgow CC, assaulted inmate (MIN contrary to the requirements of section 13.7 of the Custodial Corrections Operations Procedures Manual, Using Force on Inmates. I find there is no evidence to support that Officer Graf assaulted inmate
- 49. Inmate could have received his injuries when he fell onto the toilet. The only evidence supporting this allegation is in the telephone call he made to his father on the 20 February 2014.
- 50. Inmate makes no comment to SAS Turton who supervised the Assault/Injury Forms that he was assaulted by the IAT officers that day.
- 51. Inmate was interviewed by police on the 30 April 2014 and stated that he was getting legal advice and did not wish to supply a statement.

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Allegation – Finding

- 52. That on the 19 February 2014, failed to use a video recorder to record the targeted intelligence based search of Cell 208, 5.1 Unit at Lithgow CC, contrary to the requirements of section 13.7 of the Custodial Corrections Operations Procedures Manual, Using Force on Inmates. I find there is sufficient evidence to support this allegation and it is therefore substantiated.
- 53. There is evidence that information was received that a large quantity of drugs was in Cell 208. When receiving this information steps should have been taken to video record the search of that cell. One of the IAT officers would have had a camera and a video recorder.
- 54. Although Officer Graf was only a junior officer on duty that day he should have made sure that a video recorder was used to record the event. I refer to Commissioner's Memorandum No: 2015/15, recent decisions from the Industrial Relations Commission (IRC)<sup>26</sup>.

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- 55. It should be noted that there was a further search of Cell 208 on the 20 February 2014 when officers received information from a phone call made by inmate that he had a gaol made sharp implement weapon in his cell.
- 56. On the 20 February 2014 when the search was conducted by officers it was video recorded (See Attachment 6 Disc of the search). It should be noted Officer Graf was not involved in the search of Cell 208 on the 20 February 2014.
- 57. Officer Graf has admitted that the policy of the centre is to only start video recording when contraband is found. This simply leaves open for complaints to be made by the inmates that contraband was planted in their cell. When conducting searches for contraband all searches should start to be recorded when they enter the cell.

#### 3<sup>rd</sup> Allegation - Finding

- Made a false report on the Incident Reporting Module (IRM) relating to the targeted intelligence based search of Cell 208, 5.1 Unit at Lithgow CC on the 19 February 2014, contrary to the requirements of section 13.1 of the Custodial Corrections Operations Procedures Manual, Serious Incident Reporting. I find that there is sufficient evidence to support this allegation and it is therefore substantiated.
- 59. The IRM No: 92719 regarding the search of Cell 208 on the 19 February 2014 was submitted by SCO Walker, the senior officer on the search team and not Officer Graf.
- 60. However his name does appear on that document and in the summary it states; 'IAT officers were unable to intervene in time to stop the offender disposing of an unidentified article in the toilet'. 'Offender offered medical attention by Justice Health at Centre Clinic'. This is not mentioned in his report.
- officer Graf has stated he did not see inmate try to dispose of any article in the toilet. He has further stated that he only became aware of that when SCO Walker told him. Officer Graf was unaware how inmate received his injuries. Although in the IRM summary it states that inmate was offered medical attention by Justice Health at the Centre Clinic. Surely Officer Graf was aware that an IRM was submitted by SCO Walker which contained that information.
- 62. Although this allegation refers to OPM 13.1 Serious Incident Reporting, it states at 13.1.1; 'The submission of an IRM report does not remove the obligation of personnel to write Incident Reports and complete other documentation as stipulated in each of the policies in CSNSW Operational Procedures Manual'.

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- 63. 13.1.2 Mandatory Reporting of Incidents states; 'Although an on-line IRM report may have been entered, other manual reports still have to be written by the personnel involved in the incident and then submitted to the general manager before ceasing duty'. Officer Graf would have been aware that reports were submitted by the other officers.
- 64. There is the fact that inmate had injuries, which were later treated by the Justice Health nurse and he was later conveyed to the Lithgow to Hospital. There is also the fact that this was a targeted search and was not photographed or videoed.

#### Recommendations

65. That this report and documents be forwarded to the decision maker for their information and attention.
