


STATUTORY DECLARATION
OATHS ACT 1900, NSW, EIGHTH SCHEDULE

I, Yuning Wang of suite 102, 185 Elizabeth Street, Sydney, in the State of New South Wales, do solemnly and sincerely declare that:

1. I am a qualified interpreter in Cantonese. I am a NAATI Accredited Cantonese Interpreter and my NAATI number is 60628. I am competent to interpret between the English language and Cantonese.
2. On 10 October 2019 I was present at suite 102 of 185 Elizabeth Street, Sydney, in the State of New South Wales, and met with the Authorised Witness Justin Lewis ("the Authorised Witness") and the Declarant May Ho YEE ("the Declarant") for the purpose of providing interpreting services to enable the Declarant to make a statutory declaration.
3. I spoke with the Declarant on a number of occasions in the Cantonese language and I established that this is her customary language.
4. Before the Declarant signed the statutory declaration, I truly interpreted, to the best of my skill and ability:
 - The contents of the statutory declaration (annexed and marked "A") which were read aloud to the Declarant by the Authorised Witness;
 - I also subsequently read out the entire contents of the statutory declaration in the Cantonese language;
 - The warning provided to the Declarant by the Authorised Witness; and
 - The questions that the Authorised Witness asked the Declarant.
5. Before the Declarant made the statutory declaration, I truly interpreted, the best of my skill and ability, the Declarant's responses from the Cantonese language to the English language.
6. I do not have a personal relationship with the Declarant.
7. Other than payment for professional service, I receive no financial or other benefit from the matters to which the Declarant's statutory declaration relates.

STATUTORY DECLARATION

I, May Ho Yee of 100 Hay Street, Sydney, in the State of New South Wales, do solemnly and sincerely declare that:

1. I affirmed an Affidavit on 26 September 2019 that was produced to the Independent Commission Against Corruption ("ICAC") pursuant to a summons on 30 September 2019.
2. In this statutory declaration I wish to clarify and correct matters contained in the Affidavit.
3. In paragraph 25 of my Affidavit I stated:

Sometime after I gave evidence at the Compulsory Examination in December 2018 Jonathan approached me in the restaurant and told me that Mr Wong wanted to speak with me.

4. After being given the opportunity to think about this more carefully and made aware of what my son Jonathan told ICAC in his evidence on 1 October 2019 I now remember that the meeting I had with Mr Wong took place on a date around the time when I received notification that I would be required to give evidence at the Public Enquiry that commenced on 26 August 2019.
5. I understand that the Summons requiring me to give evidence at the Public Enquiry was received by email by my son Valentine on about 29 July 2019.
6. I now believe that the meeting I had with Mr Wong took place either within a few days before or after 29 July 2019.
7. In paragraph 29 of my Affidavit I also said:

Jonathan was present but did not say anything while I was speaking with Mr Wong on this occasion.


8. Again after being given the opportunity to think about this more carefully, I believe that Jonathan took me to the room and left while I had the conversation with Mr Wong.
9. In paragraph 18 of the Affidavit I stated:

It was a meeting attended by at about 3pm by myself, my husband Stanley Yee, Valentine and Jonathan.

10. I have since been reminded that our accountant Stephen Yu was also present at this meeting that took place in a private room at the Emperors Garden Restaurant.



