Thanks for the update.

The Heads of Agreement states that the Conservatorium is responsible for all operating costs incurred in relation to the asset which, as is normal industry practice, includes the responsibility for repairs and maintenance

Capital remains the responsibility of the building owner. At this early stage of the project it is difficult to know the likely future capital budget required, however we would conservatively propose that ~\$500k p.a. is set aside in a sinking fund that would build to provide a pool from which to undertake necessary capital works in ~5 year increments. This will be important for a high profile and high use asset.

We look forward to further updates.

- A quick update on this project following my meeting with the Premier's Office yesterday afternoon:

 The Premier is keen to announce this Friday that \$20.5m funding has been reserved for the Recital Hall component of Stage 2 of the Wagga
 - Conservatorium project I've advised the PO that this announcement can be facilitated through a reservation from the Regional Communities Development Fund, which opened for project nominations this week
 - The PO will work with the DPO so this project is nominated for that fund by the DP the Premier's advisor leading this work and the DP's CoS have discussed the project late yesterday
 - I advised the PO that I would work with agencies to try and quantify the likely ongoing costs for NSW Government (above the \$20.5m initial capital costs) to maintain the Recital Hall and also options for ownership / management

Hi Berge,

- As requested please find below information on the Riverina Conservatorium of Music (RCM).

 Property NSW is owner of the former RMS site at 1 Simmons Street, Wagga Wagga. Following recent ERC approvals, Property NSW has entered into a Heads of Agreement for a long-term lease of the site to the RCM.
 - The commencement of the lease will be subject to a \$10 million program of works (Stage 1) to adapt the building from its current commercial office configuration to make it suitable for the administration and music tuition uses required by the RCM.

 The government has approved the \$10 million to fund site master planning and the Stage 1 capital works which will be undertaken by Property NSW
 - working in partnership with RCM.


- Stage 1 scope includes:
 Development of a master plan and cost estimate for the entire site (stages 1 and 2)
 Refurbishment of the current main building to enable teaching and administration for the RCM. Highlights include multiple teaching spaces, rehearsal rooms, study room, office space and video teaching facilities.
- Subject to the development approval process, Stage 1 is expected to be completed by the end of 2019.
- Stage 2 scope is to be finalised during the master planning process. The focus of stage 2 is the construction of a Recital Hall, the indicative cost of which is
- \$20.5 million to provide state of the art performance space with capacity for up to 300 patrons.

 Chris Can you please add comment on funding sources should they choose to proceed with Stage 2?

 The government's commitment to RCM includes recurring grant funding to cover the annual cost of occupying and maintaining the new conservatorium.

Hi James

Thanks. Just ran into Berge at 52MP. Yes, he is very focused on this.

The estimated cost of the Recital Hall has been taken from the specs generated by RCM less the embellishments (like commercial space) proposed by RCM. There is a reasonable amount of fat in the budget because we don't have a well developed scope capable of being tested by a QS. It does include demolition of existing improvements to make way for the Recital Hall and reinstatement of things like car parking and landscaping. We have also materially increased the budget for AV and technology as that seemed very light on in the RCM cost estimates.

Note, I think the PO will want an image of what the site will look like rather than the floor plan. We don't have anything, so you would need to pull a concept image from the USP the RCM submitted and try and show an image that focuses on Stage 1 just in case Stage 2 turns out to be something different.
