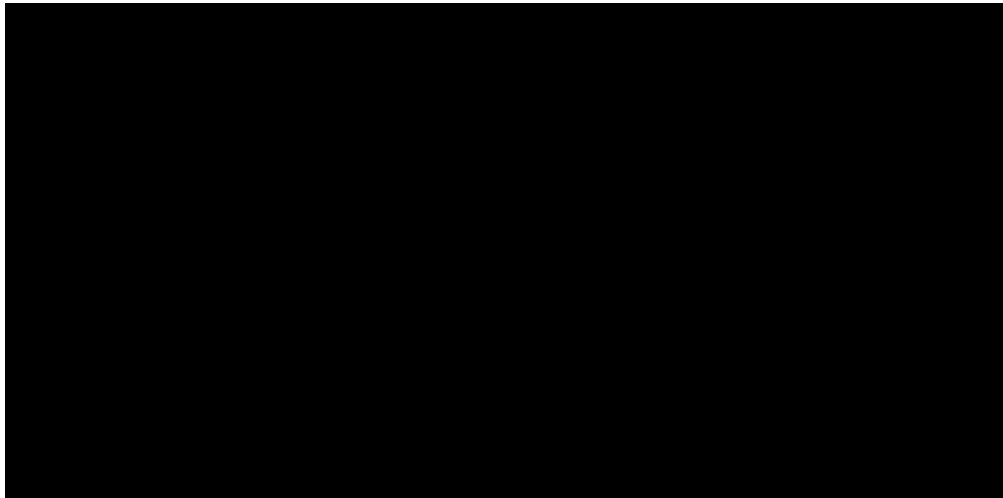


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MR ROBERTSON: Well, did the footprint of the building ever come to be stretched in the sense of it being larger than what was originally intended or was there always sufficient size in all the various general arrangements and concept planning to fit a facility that would fit 650 banquet style?

20 ---Originally we had, there, there was a different, it would have been a different setup. We, we cut it down to, to two offices to make the, the actual conference facility area bigger.

So, the original plan was a building that would have more substantial office facilities, a conference area/dining area, a hall of fame and a few other things, is that right?---Yes.

And you're saying, what, ultimately to fit all of the seats in, or enough room to fit all the seats in, the size of the office space was shrunk. Is that right?

30 ---Yes. And the hall of fame was built into the, into the foyer entrance area so we didn't have to have a separate area for a, a hall of fame. That was integrated.

THE COMMISSIONER: The original idea, as I understood, Mr Turner, was to integrate all the ACTA offices on Copland Street into this new structure, wasn't it?---Yes.

And that never happened?---No.
